## **Lay Director's Report:**

The Foundational Charism of Cursillo is a gift inspired and communicated by the Holy Spirit to our Founder, Eduardo Bonnín, who shared it with us.

Through a deeper friendship with Mallorca and the Foundation of Eduardo Bonnín Aguiló (FEBA) our access to the writings of Eduardo Bonnín, deepened our understandings of the Foundational Charism and improved our English translations of his writings. We were informed of a "Step by Step Rector's Guide" for the Cursillos in Christianity authored by Eduardo Bonnín and was to be included in his final "Spiritual Testament". Eduardo wanted to leave the original intention and gift of the charism for all leaders in the movement.

The United States Secretariat has been studying this Rector's Guide and created a workshop to share it with all the dioceses. These workshops were introduced first to our Regional Coordinators in November 2018,

and then to our Regions at their Spring 2019 Regional meetings.

We are Region III (Western NY and Pennsylvania, Ohio and West Virginia.) Myself, Karen Trimper, Marge Fetterman, Bill Gross, Diane Putt, Deacon Gary and Gail Terrana attended the Region III workshop in Pittsburgh explaining the major points of the new Step by Step format and the reason why it is important to study and use this guide from Eduardo. We will present these ideas at the next couple School of Leaders. I urge everyone who can attend to please come on June 29 as we discuss the proposed changes to our weekends.

We just completed men's weekend #223 where we welcomed 15 new Cursillistas. It was wonderful as usual. ## **Spiritual Director's Reflection:**

I gave a talk recently and during the Q&A, I was asked:

"How do we reconcile the vastly different character of God from the Old Testament (OT) and the New Testament (NT)."

I teasingly began my response with — "Do you mean the *Loving* God of the OT and the God of *Judgment* of the NT?" There were many puzzled looks and the person who asked the question quickly replied, "No, the other way around."

I explained that the truth is that there are many passages in the OT that depict God's

love in incredible ways. *For example:* the book of Hosea - one of my favorites. It's an incredible love story about how deeply God is in love with His people, His creation and how much He is hurt when we are separated from Him.

Conversely, in the NT, Jesus talks about hell quite directly. He comes right out and says, "if your eye causing you to sin, pluck it out." It's better to enter eternal life with one eye than to hell…"

We need to *be careful* how we look at and characterize Scripture.

But what do we do about these two *competing* images of God?

One of the reasons we run into trouble with this often-asked question, is that we tend to *separate* these two aspects of God that *we really need to <u>keep together</u>*.

We are quick to rip apart God's justice from His love/mercy/forgiveness. We love the concept of a God who is loving and merciful and pats us on the head. But we always want to separate that notion of God, the source of all holiness and righteousness, from our God who is also our *judge*. We prefer to sweep that reality under the carpet and decouple those two characteristics. But in doing so, we miss the *richness and wisdom of God in Scripture!* 

The God of the *entire Bible* is a God who is utterly pure, utterly holy and we are an utterly sinful people because of what we've done against Him and each other.

We should want God to be a holy, righteous God of judgment – because if He isn't, who is going to uphold goodness, law, rights and dignity? To what extent?

On the other hand, the Bible is very clear that He is a God of amazing love and forgiveness.

To reconcile these two images of God – first, we must recognize that forgiveness, love and mercy *contradict* justice.

For example: If you truly committed some heinous crime - the police arrest you, they hastily convene a courtroom with a jury of your peers, and you are tried before the judge who sentences you for 20 years. The judge has been <u>just</u>. But has she/he been merciful? No – no mercy at all.

Let's re-run that same narrative – but this time the judge says, "You should be sentenced for 20 years, but today I'm feeling merciful – now get out of my courtroom before I change my mind!" And you run out of the court as fast as your little legs can carry you!

Now, has the judge been <u>forgiving/merciful</u>? *Yes*. Has she/he been just? *No* – she/he has *ignored* the rule book.

Because mercy/forgiveness and justice *always contradict*!

If, as in our example, we exercise justice we have to ignore forgiveness/mercy; if we ignore forgiveness/mercy we have to overlook justice. Therefore, if God is both just *and* merciful – we have a problem.

What do we do? Do we just *throw out* the characteristics of God we *don't like* and only keep the ones we do?

The NT has the answer to what would otherwise be a contradiction to the heart of God –the Cross of Jesus. The God of the entire Bible loves us so much that He brilliantly, wisely and divinely exercises His mercy, not at the expense of justice, but through justice... Through the justice of the Cross of His only Son, Jesus!

Were it not for the Cross of Jesus Christ, <u>we</u> would be paying the penalty we deserved; where justice was upheld but Jesus took on our blame and punishment - *that should have fallen on us!* 

Jesus' Cross solves that contradiction in the heart of God.

What we see in some of those difficult passages in the OT is the *reality* we deserve. We come face-to-face with what justice really *looks like* and how terrible and *destructive* sin really is - along with its consequences.

We need to be realistic and remember - that is what each one of us really *deserves* for the way that we have disobeyed God, mistreated both Him and each other in horrendously sinful ways.

As uncomfortable as some of those OT (and some NT) passages are – they remind us of the awesome holiness, righteousness and justice of God. And, they should send us *running* to the *mercy* and *forgiveness* and *love* of Christ's Cross where Jesus took the punishment that should have been ours. THANK YOU AND PRAISE YOU JESUS! Peace and all good things!
