I have a daily inspirational calendar that usually offers a perky and timely message no matter what the occasion. Today, a couple of days past the conclusion of Women's Cursillo 233 it says this:

Share the message God gives you.

This test will become your testimony. He has taken the intended evil and rewoven it into his curriculum. Why? So that you can teach others what he has taught you. Your mess can become your message.

Anyone familiar with the various happenings of the most recent Cursillo weekend can surely say an Amen! to that. We were faced with an impossible situation that threatened to cancel the weekend midway through (or at least disrupt it to the point of making it unrecognizable as a Cursillo). Wastewater was rising in the floor drains of the kitchen and bathrooms. It was Saturday morning. We were advised that a plumber could not be contacted until Monday. We were told that we may not be able to serve meals or use the restrooms. Things looked bleak.

The palanca team gathered to pray. A plumber was contacted by the building manager but when the plumber arrived, he said there was no blockage for him to attend to; the problem was that the septic tank was full – and the rain was making matters worse. Fr. Karl was concerned that the situation could impact the weekend Masses. We were running out of options.

The team leaders got together in the afternoon to plan how to proceed if we needed to leave the building. The talks would be given, but we would lose mealtimes, one on one discussions, the Saturday evening

programs, Las Mananitas, breakfast and lunch on Sunday, etc. It wouldn't be ideal but what else could WE do? Nothing.

Seconds later the building manager stepped in to announce that the septic tank had been successfully pumped out and, if we could do without taking showers, we would be ok. What's the message? The Cursillo weekend is run by the Holy Spirit and only by the Holy Spirit. The Weekend went ahead as planned and was a spectacular success. Fifteen babe chicks were welcomed into our community, and they will have stories to tell for years to come. Congratulations to the team and new Cursillistas of Women's 233!

Spiritual Advisor Report:

I was reading one of my x-ray journals and came across an article titled, "Acts of the Apostles Gets a CT Scan." It turns out that in 1962 Morgan Library and Museum purchased a manuscript of the Book of the Acts of the Apostles. It was one of the earliest manuscripts ever found! This would make it likely to be more accurate than any scripture manuscript we have. But its parchment was so old and fragile, that it could not even be opened. They saved it with hopes that technology would one day be available to read it.

It makes you wonder: does it say something that would go against what we already believe about Jesus? It could change everything! Well, according to this recent article, last year they did develop a way to read the pages without even touching them. They used a Micro CT Scanner and special software at the University

of Kentucky. The parchment paper and the ink had different signals and they printed out every page. So, what did it say? I read quickly since, as you know, we just lived the 233rd Women's Cursillo Weekend. What if all that we know about Jesus has been changed by this new and likely more accurate manuscript?

It turned out that it was nearly word for word the same as the other manuscripts that we have. There were a couple differences in spellings but nothing more!

In the Acts of the Apostles, there are many disagreements among the members of the early Church. The disagreements were usually about physical things like circumcision and how Mosaic Law applied to the people. As humans, back then and now, we spend a lot of time assuring we have every detail sorted out, organized, validated, and even CT scanned! It is important to make sure our data is accurate, but at a certain point we know God is calling us to accept the validity of our faith and move on to putting it into action!

To accept the unchanging, unquestionable truth of Jesus Christ. To accept that Judgement Day is now and that when we choose to believe and follow Jesus and live his way, we have chosen and judged ourselves worthy to enter the Kingdom of Heaven both here on earth and for eternity!

It was so overwhelmingly wonderful that at our Cursillo Weekend at St. Vincent's, fourteen women were transformed as they fully embraced Jesus as their brother and then set out to increase his Kingdom here on Earth.

Historian Report:

Buffalo Cursillo History May , 2024 #28

"Cursillo, Ecumenism and Koinonia," Part II

A Protestant Cursillo Movement "Koinonia" was inspired and developed in Findley, Ohio in 1972 and proved to be successful. Since that time, Koinonia had spread to other areas, including Rochester, N.Y. The weekend follows the basic concept of the Cursillo Weekend and follow-up program in the growth in Piety, Study and Action.

One of the goals of the 1975 Buffalo Pastoral Plan was to "establish dialogue with members of other Christian faiths who share our goal of Christianizing the world".

In May 1975, Dick Guyette (Men's #23) and his wife, Mary Jane (Women's #12) invited other Cursillistas to form a study group to accomplish this goal. They were interested in meeting with others who felt that the Cursillo Method would be an effective and useful tool for Protestant groups in bringing Christ to their environments. The small study group worked all summer to get Koinonia off the ground. Many Cursillistas indicated that they had Protestant friends and/or relatives who were interested in a Cursillo-type renewal.

A Christian gathering of Cursillo members and prospective Koinonians was planned for August 27th at the Ebenezer United Church of Christ in Ebenezer. It was to be a "Diocesan Reunion" type of service with Scripture readings, a witness talk, songs, and a social to follow.

In order to introduce their Protestant friends to the concept of Koinonia, it was recommended to bring them to this service. An Apostolic endeavor also encouraged Cursillistas to go with their Protestant friends to invite their Pastors to the evening service and to the Weekend. Applications for the Koinonia were available at the service and through the Guyettes.

The first Koinonia Weekends were held at Bishop Gibbons High School: Men's #1 on September 19-21, and Women's #1 on October 3-5, 1975. Twenty-five men and women consented to represent the Cursillo Community by serving on the teams for the first Men's and Women's weekends. Each team followed an abbreviated Cursillo schedule for the weekend, which began on Friday evening and ended on Sunday afternoon. The same men and women also committed themselves to Ultreyas and Group Reunions with the candidates for several months following the Weekend.

The spiritual power of Palanca and the community presence at the Holy Hour, Las Mananitas and Closing were as fruitful for Koinonia as for a Cursillo Weekend.

Later, these Christian Brothers and Sister Babe Chicks became Koinonia team members reaching out to Candidates in their respective Churches and holding their Weekends there.

This was the beginning of the Koinonia Movement in Western New York that took hold and has continued to flourish for years in the Protestant Community.

Our Women's Weekend #233, April 25th to the 28th, brought fourteen women candidates and an awesome team together. The closing mass on Sunday was guided by the Holy Spirit. Fr. Ron Sajdak was an inspiration, the music ministry was, as always, spirit filled and the candidates witness' were a beautiful testimony to the team's love through Jesus Christ. God is good.

I continue to pray for the blessings our Father gives us and my most heartfelt appreciation goes out to everyone who participated in the Central Niagara Catholic Community project.

When God has work to be done, get out of the way! Women's Weekend No. 233 (April 25-28) was not to be stopped. In spite of a major plumbing problem that shut down the use of toilets and showers starting Saturday afternoon of the Weekend, in the school building of St. Vincent de Paul Church campus, where the Weekends are held, the program continued.

The only functioning toilets were in the church wing of the building. With worry from the plumbing service that even those toilets would eventually be off limits, a substitute plan for the Weekend program quickly needed to be put in motion. However, God did not need a substitute plan from mortal men and women. No sooner was a substitute plan designed to move the remainder of the Weekend to another day, God kicked the gremlins out of the septic tank system to allow limited use of a few toilets in the school building. Showering was still prohibited. The Weekend schedule went forward as originally planned as it has for a couple hundred Weekends before this one. This entire scenario was a Cursillo "first."

It was miraculous! If you ever had to call a plumbing service for an emergency situation on a Saturday afternoon for a commercial sized building, you know what we mean. Service crews and trucks are not immediately available until a day or two later. And the sewage problem not only affected the team and candidates, but the Palanca Team and Kitchen Crew as well. In addition, if the program needed to be adjusted to another day, this would have affected the Saturday night Serenade, Sunday morning's Las Mananitas and the meals being brought in by the various Ultreyas. How would word reach the Cursillo Community in time to inform them of this adjusted schedule if it was to be implemented?

Team members, Christine Shilen and Loretta Schabel prayed over the plumber who came out to evaluate the problem. And when you, the Community, offered prayers, Masses, Rosaries and sacrifices for the Weekend, you had no idea how important they would become. The lesson in all of this is, God's work cannot be overshadowed, and His people need to pray unceasingly because you never know when or where the prayers will be applied. Please add St. Vincent's Church to your prayer list that the septic tank system is repaired with minimal expense to its church community.

The candidates were totally accepting of the showering prohibition. This was their palanca - - extreme palanca! Let us now welcome our 14 Babe chicks who as a group experienced together a Cursillo "first": Julie Winters, Irene Kapatots, Sylvia Zach, Ketty Sheff, Katie Black, Mary Van Splunder, Allison Smerka,

Lori Hasey, Kathy Redden, Bridget Anger, Christine Varnum, Marie Bukowski-Hehr, Clare Gavigan and Chris Porto .

Cursillistas attended ten masses in the Central Niagara Catholic Family of Church to introduce all the parishes to Cursillo on the weekend of April 13-14. Many Cursillistas attended the witness made by Paul Zucarelli, a National Catholic Speaker and Author in April. Paul had nine cardiac arrests and was dead for two hours. Through intercessory prayer of many, Paul survived with no brain damage and now lives to testify his witness about Heaven and Christ's deep love for us. A number of Cursillistas raved about Paul's witness so I went to hear him too. They had it right, Paul's story was eye opening and demonstrated his love, faith and trust in Christ. It was very moving and made me reflect on my life and the strength of my love, faith and trust in God. I credit the Cursillo method for even allowing me to reflect at the depth I did. Which part of the Cursillo tripod was attending Paul's witness? piety – yes, study – check, action – yep, ...hat trick!
