The whole world seems to be at a boiling point of no return and yet daily life goes on, people celebrate birthdays and go to softball games, and another church closes. I was wondering, as I viewed the seven empty benches in front of me at the 8:00 Sunday Mass, will these empty benches be filled with the refugees of locally closed churches, or will they remain empty? I would hope that they're filled to capacity, but I have my doubts. I'm running low on hope, and that's not good. What's a body to do? Where can I get Hope when there seems to be such a short supply of it?

Enter the Catholic Church and the Catechism of the Catholic Church in particular. We all have an opportunity this summer to make a friend, be a friend and bring a friend to Christ. Pre-Cursillo Report:

"Bring your colors for Christ"

In Christianity, evangelism or witnessing is the act of preaching the gospel with the intention of sharing the message and teachings of Jesus Christ. It is something associated with Christian mission. Christian groups who encourage evangelism are sometimes known as evangelists.

Cursillo (Cur-See'yo) is a Spanish word meaning a "short course". Cursillos de Christianidad is the full title of the movement. This phase literally means a short course of lectures in Christian living, but it is not intended to simply refer to a course of instruction.

What are the three pillars? "Cursillo, that is a word purified through experience, affirmed by fruits, that today travels the world...by the way of the three pillars of Cursillo. **Prayer, Study, and Action.**

In the early days in Spain, and the people who came to participate in the Cursillo Movement, realized the value of the symbol of the Rooster and its beautiful tail feathers. To the Spanish the Rooster was symbolic of the rainbow in the Old Testament where God makes a covenant with His People.

The rainbow colors of the tail feathers have a special and significant meaning to the Christian.

- ♣ Green denoted new life, growth and God's beauty of nature that surrounds us. It symbolizes the ordinary times of the Church year.
- <u>Blue</u> denotes loyalty, our commitment to God and His people. It denotes truth and justice and the waters of our Baptism.
- **Ψ** Purple denotes our dying and rising again along with the suffering of Jesus Christ.
- ¥ Yellow and Orange hues denote warmth, light of a candle, the rays of the sun and changing seasons. They remind us of the love of God's Son in our lives.
- Red denotes celebration, joy and confirmation. It is symbolic of our feast days within the Church, Christmas Day and Pentecost.

What is the Cursillo motto?

Make a Friend – Be a Friend – Bring a Friend to Christ!

In the Cursillo Movement, we help one another, teach, support, and hold each other accountable in growing in our faith through the tripod of: Piety (heart) What we do to grow in grace and holiness.

Cursillo exists to ignite a passion for God. This method of spirituality inspires a personal relationship with Christ and the community of faith that is created from this encounter.

In Pre- Cursillo we evangelize and witness and with the Grace of God,
